- Morland Community Foundation received 501(c)3 approval 1994
- Charitable Purposes: Promotion and enhancement of the quality of life for the citizens of Morland and surrounding area:

Combating community deterioration with emphasis on preservation and utilization of existing and historical buildings, and

Responding to the charitable, education and benevolent needs of the community, including efforts to combat deterioration of the quality of rural life and urban decay

- Grocery Store building constructed in 1915 and, to our knowledge, continuously operated as a grocery store until it closed in October 2005.
- Owner tried to sell 2-3 years before closing due to health & age
- The building & equipment in extremely poor condition
- The building historically important to the community.
- 2006, January Foundation purchased building with intent to refurbish & rent for use as grocery store
- 2007 May installed new roof & Midwest Energy did energy audit
- 2009 City of Morland approved CDBG R (stimulus) to refurbish main part of building w/energy efficient windows, 2 handicapped accessible entrances, electrical wiring, plumbing, 3 zones of heating, AC, insulation, 2 handicapped bathrooms refurbish wooden floors and metal ceilings,
- Condition of the grant -no retail or government business conducted on premises
- Flood plain Flood proof building over a year & \$23,000 for LOMAR approval
- 2011 purchased used refrigeration equipment from Luray- volunteers in process of installing- applicant for manager and a food supplier
