



#### **Map of Kansas Food and Farm Councils**



## Variety of Data Sources

- SECONDARY (Existing) DATA ANALYSIS
  - USDA Food Environment Atlas
  - Agricultural Census
  - Community Commons- Food Environment report
  - Business databases
  - Bureau of Labor Statistics
- PRIMARY (New) DATA COLLECTION
  - Surveys
  - Focus groups
  - Stakeholder interviews
  - FEAST
  - Store/restaurant site assessments


