USDA Rural Development

Rural Kansas Assistance

- \$253 million invested in 2015
 - Job creation and economic development
 - Improvements to critical infrastructure
 - Upgrades to essential community facilities
 - Housing opportunities

Business & Industry Guaranteed Loan

Onaga Country Market

- \$500,000 Business & Industry Guaranteed Loan to purchase equipment needed to construct and operate a new grocery store
- Fire destroyed previous building
- Multiple funding partners including: Network
 Kansas, City of Onaga, Pottawatomie County



Rural Energy for America Program (REAP)

Haverkamp Grocery in Centralia

- Locally owned since 1973
- Coolers had not been updated in over 20 years
- \$30,988 REAP Grant to install new energy efficient coolers
- New cooler cases have lowered the store's electric bill by at least \$600 per month



Rural Energy for America Program (REAP)

Moon's Grocery Store in Humboldt

- \$65,000 REAP Grant in 2015
 - Upgraded lighting to LED lights
 - Replaced open coolers with refrigeration display cases
 - Saving approximately \$38,000 per year with new energy efficiency upgrades



- \$8,154 REAP Grant in 2014
 - Upgrade old HVAC system, to a new more energy efficient system
 - Saving approximately \$7,500 per year

Rural Business Enterprise Grant

High Plains Food Cooperative


- \$47,250 Rural Business Enterprise Grant to Rocky Mountain Farmers Union
- Grant funds were used to prepare a strategic plan for High Plains Food Coop to explore expanding production, distribution and marketing, scaling up and the capacity to deliver fresh produce to Kansas and Colorado



Rural Economic Development Loan & Grant

Haven Foodliner

- \$160,000 Rural Economic
 Development Loan to Ark Valley
 Rural Electric Cooperative
 Association
- Transfer of ownership to new owners Doug and Lucinda Nech, as 20-year owner of the store retired
- Only grocery store in Haven, closest grocery store is 25 miles away



Rural Economic Development Loan & Grant

Schwinn Produce Farm & The Barn in Leavenworth

- Operated a produce farm since 1974
- \$100,000 REDLG Loan to Leavenworth
 Jefferson Electric Cooperative for Schwinn
 Produce Farm
- Construction of a new building and expansion of the produce farm



Rural Business Development Grant

University of Northern Iowa Institute for Decision Making (Cedar Falls)

• \$32,000 RBDG Grant

 Conduct a feasibility study on how incorporating food hubs into rural grocery stores can help prevent and absolve food deserts in rural lowa

Value Added Producer Grant

Farm Fresh HQ Coop Association in Lawrence

- \$244,943 Value-Added Producer Grant
- Grant will be used for working capital to finance business start-up costs for a Regional Food Hub to serve northeast Kansas, northwest Missouri, and the Kansas City metropolitan area



Community Facilities Loan & Grant

Pittsburg Farmers Market Inc.

- \$110,000 Community Facilities Loan and \$82,000 Community Facilities Grant
- New pavilion building to house the Pittsburg Farmer's Market
- Has space for approximately 20 vendors
 - Tomatoes, cucumbers, zucchini, squash, peas, potatoes, strawberries, Swiss chard, radishes, beats, garlic, cabbage, elk meat, eggs, chicken/goat/beef meat, and much more
